


CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency Landing Ground (Un-official).
 PROPRIETORS: R.C.Mission, Bathurst Id., N.T.
 POSITION: About 45 miles N. by W. of Darwin, adjacent to the Mission Station on the S.E. end of Bathurst Id.
 Lat. 11° 45'S. Long. 130° 42½'E.
 MAGNETIC VARIATION: 4° E. approx.
 DISTINCTIVE FEATURES: Mission Buildings immediately north of ground.
 MARKINGS: Nil. Wind indicator tee.
 DESCRIPTION: Red sandy surface, good in all weathers.
 DIMENSIONS: N.W. - S.E. 660 yards.
 N.E. - S.W. 440 yards.
 HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 25 ft.
 APPROACHES: N.W., N.E., & S.E. - Open.
 S.W. Heavy timber 40 ft. high.
 SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Bathurst Id. is covered with dense timber.
 PETROL AND OIL: Mission Stn. (50 gals. only)
 WATER SUPPLY: Mission Stn.
 WORKSHOPS: Darwin, 60 miles by lugger.
 HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.
 TELEPHONE: Nil.
 TELEGRAPH: Wireless at Mission.
 NEAREST TOWN: Darwin, 60 miles by lugger.
 CHARGES: Nil.
 REMARKS: The Civil Aviation Dept. has no control over this ground, which is maintained by the Mission authorities. Pilots should make a careful inspection before landing. There is a monthly launch service between Darwin and the Mission.
