



**CLASS OF GROUND:** Aerodrome licensed for all types of landplanes.  
**PROPRIETORS:** Beverley Road Board.  
**POSITION:** South of Beverley township. Lat. 32°07'S. Long. 116°55'E.  
**MAGNETIC VARIATION:** About 4½°E.  
**DISTINCTIVE FEATURES:** Aerodrome lies between the Avon River and the Great Southern Railway.  
**MARKINGS:** White circle and wind indicator.  
**DESCRIPTION:** Undulating sandy loam. After rain the ground is likely to be soft in the centre of the aerodrome, to the West of ground mark.  
**DIMENSIONS:** Runs from 600 to 1000 yards - see plan above.  
**HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL:** About 650 feet.  
**APPROACHES:** North, timber 20' high; South, light scrub; East, light scrub and river; West, timber and railway telegraph lines 24' high.  
**SURROUNDING COUNTRY:** Undulating farm lands with timber patches. Some paddocks in the vicinity are suitable for forced landings.  
**PETROL AND OIL:** Beverley.  
**WATER SUPPLY:** River. Water tap at saleyards and railway yards about 100 yards away.  
**WORKSHOPS:** Beverley.  
**HANGAR ACCOMMODATION:** Nil.  
**TELEPHONE:** Beverley.  
**TELEGRAPH:** Beverley.  
**NEAREST TOWN:** Beverley.  
**NEAREST RAILWAY STATION:** Beverley.  
**CHARGES:**
