




CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency landing ground.
PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.
POSITION: About $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of homestead. Roughly 50 miles N.N.E. from Carnarvon.

Lat: $24^{\circ} 27\frac{1}{2}'$ S. Long: $114^{\circ} 2'$ E.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West approx.

LANDMARKS: The ground is a T shaped clearing in scrub.

MARKINGS: Ground mark and wind indicator.

SURFACE: Good level surface, red sandy soil, liable to be soft after heavy rain.

DIMENSIONS: North-South 800 yards; East-West 800 yards.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 200 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: Over scrub 8 feet high in all directions.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Timber and scrub, with some open patches. Generally unsuitable for forced landings.

PETROL & OIL: At homestead.

WATER SUPPLY: At homestead.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE: At homestead.

TELEGRAPH: Carnarvon Post Office.

NEAREST TOWN & SEAPORT: Carnarvon.

REMARKS: Stripmap No. 54.
