IT is hereby notified that an Emergency Landing Ground has been established at BOORONG, NEW SOUTH WALES.

The following particulars regarding this Emergency Landing Ground are published for information:—

<i>Proprietors</i>	Commonwealth of Australia. (Controller of Civil Aviation, Melbourne.)
<i>Position</i>	Latitude, 34° 20' S.; longitude, 142° 23' E. Situated on right bank of Murray River, 17 miles east of Mildura.
<i>Distinctive Features</i> ..	Scarp of river on bend $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south-east.
<i>Markings</i>	White cross. Wind indicator on boundary about 70 yards north of interior angle of "L".
<i>Description</i>	"L" shaped ground rising slightly towards edge, good sandy soil suitable for use in all weathers.
<i>Dimensions for Landing</i>	550 yards north and south, 500 yards east and west.
<i>Height above Sea Level</i>	About 225 feet.
<i>Magnetic Variation</i> ..	6° 45' E. (approx.).
<i>Approaches</i>	North, south, and east, over Mallee about 20 feet high. West, over scattered scrub. Telegraph line on south-west corner.
<i>Surrounding Country</i> ..	Timbered, unfit for forced landings.
<i>Petrol and Oil</i>	Mildura, 22 miles.
<i>Water Supply</i>	River 200 yards south-west.
<i>Workshops</i>	Mildura, 22 miles.
<i>Nearest Telephone</i> ..	Mr. Withers, Mallee Cliffs.
<i>Nearest Telegraph</i> ..	Mildura.
<i>Nearest Town</i>	Mildura, 22 miles.
<i>Nearest Railway Station</i>	Mildura, 22 miles.
<i>Charges</i>	Nil.
