

## NOTICES TO AIRMEN.

### No. 24 of 1925.

IT is hereby notified that an Emergency Landing Ground has been established at BROCK'S MONUMENT, VICTORIA.

The following particulars regarding this Emergency Landing Ground are published for information:—

<i>Proprietors</i> .. ..	Commonwealth of Australia, on licence under C.A. Form 22 from Mr. J. Anderson, Romsey.
<i>Position</i> .. ..	Latitude, 37° 20' S.; longitude, 144° 41' E. Situated 3½ miles west-north-west of Romsey and 1½ miles south-south-east of Rochford.
<i>Distinctive Features</i> ..	Brock's Monument, ¾ mile south-south-west. Road along north boundary.
<i>Markings</i> .. ..	Ground marking (white cross). Wind indicator in angle of "I."
<i>Description</i> .. ..	Level surface, <sup>Fairly</sup> lightly grassed. <sup>SOME TULLOWS. N.T.A. 1/2</sup> Liable to be wet in winter, but not boggy.
<i>Dimensions for Landing</i>	North and south, 480 yards. East and west, 490 yards.
<i>Height above Sea Level</i>	About 1,800 feet.
<i>Magnetic Variation</i> ..	7° 54' E. (approximately).
<i>Approaches</i> .. ..	North, telegraph line and scattered timber along road, then open. South, rising ground, trees on ridge, about 200 yards. East, clear. West, clear for 200 yards, then low trees.
<i>Surrounding Country</i> ..	Timbered to south. Remainder small cultivation paddocks. Forced landings might be effected if care exercised in selecting site.
<i>Petrol and Oil</i> .. ..	Romsey garages, about 4 miles east.
<i>Water Supply</i> .. ..	Nearest house, ¼ mile east.
<i>Workshops</i> .. ..	Romsey garages, about 4 miles east.
<i>Hangar Accommodation</i>	Nil.
<i>Nearest Telephone &amp; No.</i>	Mr. J. Anderson—Romsey, 38.
<i>Nearest Telegraph</i> ..	Post Office, Romsey.
<i>Nearest Town</i> .. ..	Rochford, about 1 mile north-north-west.
<i>Nearest Railway Station</i>	Romsey, about 4 miles.
<i>Charges</i> .. ..	Nil.
<i>Remarks</i> .. ..	A fair emergency landing ground. Ground is best for landings in east or west directions.
