



NOTICE TO AIRMEN

BRUNETTE DOWNS, N.T.



- CLASS OF GROUND:** Aerodrome suitable for all types of landplanes.
PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.
POSITION: 200 miles N.W. of Camooweal on main Camooweal-Darwin stock route. Lat: $18^{\circ} 38'$ S. Long: $135^{\circ} 56'$ E.
MAGNETIC VARIATION: 4° E. approx.
LANDMARKS: Homestead buildings and wireless masts at south eastern corner. Brunette Creek adjacent to southern boundary.
MARKINGS: White circle, wind indicator and boundary marks. "Brunette" painted on roof between wireless masts.
SURFACE: Good. (See remarks below).
DIMENSIONS: North-South 750 yards; East-West 950 yards.
HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 750 feet approx.
APPROACHES: Wireless masts 75 feet high and station buildings at S.E. corner. Low scattered timber on north and east. South - over few trees on low ground.
SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Black soil downs with stunted trees.
PETROL & OIL: At aerodrome.
WATER SUPPLY: At Homestead.
WORKSHOPS: Machine shop and blacksmith's shop at Homestead.
WIRELESS: Wireless telephone at Homestead.
NEAREST TOWN: Camooweal, 200 miles S.E. by road.
RAILWAY STATION: Mount Isa, 320 miles S.E. by road.
REMARKS: Attention is directed to the high wireless masts in the south-east angle of aerodrome. The black soil portion of the aerodrome is unsuitable in wet weather.
