


EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND



LATITUDE: 6° 02' S; LONGITUDE: 145° 50' E; MAG. VAR: 4½° E. app.  
 ALTITUDE: 4,000 feet approx.

POSITION: North of the Ramu and between the Uria and Surina Rivers, about 60 miles south of Madang.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAP: Mercator Sheet B.8.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Grassed river flats.

LANDMARKS: Ramu River about three miles south; Surina River about two miles east; Uria River about four miles west.

Dumpsu and Koraom villages 2½ miles to N.W.

APPROACHES: Clear at both ends.

MARKINGS: Nil.

DIMENSIONS: A single strip, running E-W, 605 yds. by 75 yds.

SURFACE: Grassed level surface.

TOWN: Madang, about 100 miles north by road.

SEAPORT: Madang.

TELEPHONE: Madang.

HANGARS: Nil.

REFUELLING and REPAIRS: Nil.

WATER: At rivers nearby.

PROPRIETORS: Administration of New Guinea.

CHARGES: Nil.

SPECIAL REMARKS: This ground is maintained for emergency landings only, and as grass may sometimes grow to 18" before being cut, great care should be exercised with light aeroplanes.
