



NOTICE TO AIRMEN

JOHNSTON'S LAGOON, N.T.



CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency landing ground.

PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.

POSITION: 45 miles south of Daly Waters, immediately west of overland telegraph line.

Lat: 16° 52' S; Long: 133° 25' E.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: 4° E. approx.

LANDMARKS: Clearing in timber. Overland telegraph adjacent to south-east boundary.

MARKINGS: White cross, wind indicator and corner marks.

SURFACE: Good, level.

DIMENSIONS: N.W.-S.E. 680 yards; N.E.-S.W. 670 yards.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 800 feet approx.

APPROACHES: Over timber in all directions. Timber has been felled at ends of landing strips for a depth of 10 chains.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Timbered; unsuitable for forced landings.

PETROL & OIL: Daly Waters, 45 miles north.

Newcastle Waters, 45 miles south.

WATER SUPPLY: Frew's Ponds, about 4 miles south; but nearest sure supplies are at bores, 13 miles south and 12 miles north.

TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH: "Dunmara" Homestead, 14 miles north.

NEAREST TOWN: Newcastle Waters, 45 miles south.

REMARKS: Stripmap No.7.
