



NOTICE TO AIRMEN

WIRELESS MASTS AT CUMNOCK & LAWRENCE, N.S.W.



A high wireless mast has been erected at each of the following positions, as shown on sketches above.

CUMNOCK REGIONAL BROADCASTING STATION, 2 CR.

Lat: $32^{\circ} 56' 10''$ S. Long: $148^{\circ} 42' 43''$ E.

Approx. 49 miles S. by E. from Dubbo, or 2 miles W.S.W. from Cumnock Railway Station, on the western side of the Burrawong Creek. Stripmaps Nos. 10, 49, 52 and 60.

The mast is 660 feet high. Ground level at base is 1,766 ft. Obstruction lights are shown at night and during periods of bad visibility only while the broadcasting staff is on duty.

These lights are at the mast head and at three lower levels.

LAWRENCE REGIONAL BROADCASTING STATION, 2 NR.

Lat: $29^{\circ} 29' 33''$ S. Long: $153^{\circ} 07' 10''$ E.

Approx. 17 miles N.N.E. from South Grafton, on the western bank of the Clarence River, at Lawrence township. Stripmap No.2.

The mast is 511 feet high. Ground level at base is 60 feet.

Throughout the night, and during other periods of bad visibility, red lights are displayed at the mast head and at two lower levels. The outer boundaries of the guy anchors are also lighted.
