



NOTICE TO AIRMEN

(EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND)

TENNANT CREEK, N.T.



CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency Landing Ground.

PROPRIETORS: Commonwealth of Australia (Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne).

POSITION: About $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S.S.W. of Tennant Creek old tel. station.Lat.: $19^{\circ} 34' S.$; Long.: $134^{\circ} 14' E.$ MAGNETIC VARIATION: $4^{\circ} E.$ approx.LANDMARKS: Creek and O.T. line to North and West, tel. station about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile N.N.W.

MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.

SURFACE: Fair surface, hard red gravelly soil, should be good in all weather.

DIMENSIONS: N.-S. 484 yards; E.-W. 484 yards.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 800 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: Over low scattered scrub, some light timber (20 ft.) to South; North and West tel. line 18 ft. high.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Scattered low scrub and light timber to 20 ft.

PETROL AND OIL: Tennant Creek township, 7 miles South.

WATER SUPPLY: Old tel. station $\frac{1}{2}$ mile N.N.E.

WORKSHOPS: Tennant Creek township.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEGRAPH: Tel. station at township.

NEAREST TOWNSHIP: Tennant Creek.

RAILWAY STATION: Alice Springs, about 300 miles South.

REMARKS: Aerodrome 7 miles South, to N.-W. of hotel buildings. Strip Map No.72.
